

I had one on one classes or consultations with each of the professors. It differs a lot from the German system I am used to as I usually have classes in big groups and have a mix of listening to the professors and doing case studies/ group work or projects. I worked on a lot by myself in Serbia and got a lot more opportunities to ask about more specific things than in Germany – so my knowledge within the lessons had a chance to be deeper. I also attended one class with Serbian students which was very similar to our German courses. I think the different experiences are incredibly valuable, as they taught me different forms of organising myself and handling topics.

Additionally, I paid more than the other tenants due to the short length of my stay, which I did not know before. The landlord seemed a bit offended when I asked about it. Additionally, I was not comfortable with the facility manager just walking into the apartment and room whenever he wanted to.
