Which courses did you attend?	Contemporary Corporate Finance Web Technologies Personal Finance Training and development
Describe the general teaching system. How much and in what way does it differ from the system you nurture at your faculty? How important is such a different experience to you in terms of education?	We had consultations with the professors to talk about the subject of the course and to find topics we would work on. It differs a lot from the courses in Germany as there were no classic courses where the professor teaches in front of the students – it was a more project-based approach where we had to work on something ourselves. This was a good experience as this prepares you for work life where you often have to find solutions yourself and work on topics to present them to your team etc.
What was the language of instruction? Was the foreign language an obstacle to acquiring knowledge and taking the exam? How much has this mobility influenced the improvement of your language skills?	The language of instruction was English. The foreign language was no obstacle. The mobility influenced my English skills especially in being more confident to speak and to find words easier.
COURSES How often did you have classes?	Twice a week one course and the others were working by ourselves / in a team.
How much of the knowledge were you familiar with before the mobility? How much of the acquired knowledge is completely new to you?	Besides the course <i>Web Technologies</i> , which was totally new, I had some basic knowledge about the topics we were working on.
What are the specific acquired skills and teaching characteristics that you would share with your professors and fellow students? Why?	The ones involving the use of HTML and CSS from the course <i>Web Technologies</i> – it was so interesting to see and learn what is behind a website.
How much is the acquired knowledge useful for continuation of your studies and in practice? Explain.	The acquired knowledge is very useful as I gained some further insight into financing, which is always useful for your own personal finances and the broader understanding of the topic. Also, the course <i>Training and Development</i> was very useful (change management) as it is very applicable.
